

#### THE WORD OF THE LORD

## The theme of today's readings:

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. In Latin, the word gaudete means "rejoice." St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians tells us why we should rejoice: "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice! The Lord is at hand!" The words "I say, rejoice! The Lord is at hand!" should encourage us to make our lives right with the Lord as we prepare for the holy day that remembers and celebrates the first Advent of our Saviour (Christmas) and, at the same time, looks forward to his return as our just Judge.

First reading Zephaniah 3:14-18

The Old Testament prophet Zephaniah announces the joy that will be experienced when God comes to dwell among his covenant people.

Canticle Isaiah 12 We repeat the prophet Isaiah's hymn of joy in the promise of God, "the Holy One of Israel," coming to bring his people and the nations his gift of salvation. These are the prophecies St. John the Baptist was born to proclaim. Isaiah begins by describing the pleasure the redeemed sinner experiences because of God's great work on his behalf, which inspires both trust and gratitude. Since God is the source of their salvation, every member of the People of God knows they can trust God and not fear him if they are obedient to his commands.

**Second reading** *Philippians* 4:4-7 St. Paul admonished the Christians of Philippi (and us) to cast aside all fears and anxieties and to rejoice because the Lord is at hand. Whatever our struggles in life, we can turn to the Lord, who gives us the true peace and happiness that only comes from the graces he bestows on those who belong to him and who honour that relationship by obeying his commands and being faithful to him.

Gospel Luke 3:10-18 John the Baptist called the people to prepare themselves for the coming of the promised Messiah. In response to his preaching, the people cried out, "What then shall we do?" The message of this Sunday's readings is that during the Advent season we should ask ourselves that same question. What must we do to prepare for the coming of our Lord and Saviour as we approach the celebration of the anniversary of his First Advent? How should we make our lives right with God so we are ready for his return in the Second Advent? The answer is the same answer St. John the Baptist gave the people of his day. We must repent. We must turn away from sin and return to God, to proclaim Christ our Lord and Saviour in acts of love and mercy and enter into the joy of his peace "that surpasses all understanding".

#### **PARENTS AND CHILDREN**

It's a great joy to see so many young families in church. BLESSING OF THE BAMBINELLI At the end of the 9.30am Mass today, we will bless the bambinelli – images of the Christ Child in the Christmas Crib - made by the children in our school. The rite of Blessing of the Bambinelli was first instituted by Pope St. John Paul II. On the Third Sunday of Advent, the children of Rome are encouraged to bring the bambinelli from each of their Nativity sets to St. Peter's Square. Following the Sunday Angelus address, the Pope blesses the figurines. Now celebrated in other churches around the world, this Advent tradition is a lovely way for children to connect their Nativity scene at home to the celebration of

SYNOD FINAL DOCUMENT At the end of October the Final Document of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops (which included also non-bishops) was published. Departing from tradition, Pope Francis has not issued his own post-synodal apostolic exhortation, a teaching document of the Pope commending to the Church a synod's conclusions on a particular matter of Church life, but has adopted the Final Document of the 'Synod on Synodality' for this purpose, declaring it to be part of the 'papal magisterium'. Pope Francis has asked that the document be accepted by the Church, but it is clear that it has been met with mixed reactions across the Church. There are those who are concerned that ambiguous, imprecise phrases in the document can mean what people want them to mean, and that the document obscures, rather than clarifies, the Church's mission, while others who are keen to see the document's proposals for reform implemented without delay. Documents like this need time to be digested and understood. I encourage you to read it for yourself, though it weighs in at 28,000 words.
